# Looking For A 10<sup>th</sup> – The Mitzvah Of Morning Minyan



Many years ago, when I first arrived at Congregation Torat El and we still had evening minyan, I walked in one evening to find that there was an elderly man with his daughter who sat in the back quietly and seemed somewhat uncomfortable. I did not recognize them, but I was still relatively new myself, so it was possible that we had not yet met. After a few moments, I noticed that he was wearing a black *keriah* ribbon, the torn ribbon that is worn during *shiva*, the seven- day period of mourning after the death of an immediate family member. I was sure that he had come in to say the Mourner's Kaddish, and was glad that we just had a minyan of 10 Jews required for him to do so. When I spoke with him after the service I learned that he had suddenly and shockingly lost his mother and had used our cemetery for the

burial. And after the funeral he had nowhere to go. He was not a member of Congregation Torat El. He did not seem to be affiliated with the Jewish community in any way. He had no community to go to for support during shiva. Thankfully, he found us through our cemetery and came to grieve for his mother and seek comfort in our Jewish community. I am hopeful that, at least for those brief moments, we were able to provide him with just that.

That was many years ago, and I remember leaving thinking to myself, "Thank goodness we had a minyan!" Much has changed since those days. We now have evening minyan on Zoom and options for live stream over Shabbat, but we are struggling to get a regular morning minyan on a daily basis. That's the 'bad news.' The good news it that, thanks in part to the efforts of our Director of Ritual Engagement, Ben Laskowitz (and our *Whatsapp* minyan group), when we have someone that we know needs a minyan for Kaddish, we put out a request and usually get one. On the one hand, it is wonderful that people are "stepping up to the plate" when we know there is a need. But these days I find myself wondering about those times when we don't know there is a need; when we don't know someone has to say Kaddish; when someone wanders in looking for a minyan (member or not).

In the end, we are blessed with a small committed core of people who have dedicated themselves to daily prayer. And while I know they find this personally meaningful, I also know that many of them feel a sense of responsibility to our greater community members to attend on a regular basis. Some of our regulars (who many would recognize because they have been there for you during a time of need), are not getting any younger. Some of them can no longer drive to synagogue in the morning to help make a minyan. This is where you come in. Put quite simply, if we want to be a community that believes in the value of having a daily morning minyan, both as a place for quiet, contemplative prayer, and a place for those who have lost a loved one to grieve and honor their memory, we need to help make it so. We need your help.

I know I have written about this before. But I believe that it is important enough to our core values and identity as a *beit tefilah*, as a house of worship, to write about again. All of us are busy and there are all sorts of reasons that we can each think of for not showing up. The time does not work for us. We have to be home to help with our children, grandchildren. Our favorite class at the gym meets at the exact same time. It is too cold outside; let someone else drive to minyan. Each of these reasons is legitimate. But helping to make a minyan is not about any one of us individually. It is about all of us collectively.

I know that everyone who comes to the minyan, even infrequently, is glad that it exists. They are glad that a small group of people is making sure it happens. The trouble is, we cannot always rely on someone else. If having a minyan is really important to us, we actually have to do something concrete to help support it.

Our morning minyan takes about 30-45 minutes. Can you come once a week? Can you come once a month? Can you come three times this year? (As a bonus, if you can lead, or are interested in brushing up on skills that have become rusty, we would be glad to help you and add you into our rotation of leaders!) Regardless of how often you can make this happen, or the level of commitment you can make, I hope that each of you is willing to join us in sustaining this essential part of our sacred community.

Author Patti Mosovitz once wrote that, "One rabbi cannot make a minyan, but ten shoemakers can." Showing up is something that all of us can do. So look at your calendars, bring your family, pick a date, and please join us. **Morning minyan is Monday-Friday** at 8am, and **Sunday** at 8:30 am. **Evening Zoom minyan** is Monday-Thursday at 7pm, **Friday nights** are currently at 6:15pm, **Shabbat morning** is 9:00am. We are looking forward to praying with you, and having you join us in our daily spiritual home!




